## LET'S PHOTOSHOP: FIXING PHOTOS

Photoshop is an application for editing pixel-based images. It may be used to fix colors and blemishes, design posters or business cards, and much more.

## EDITING COLORS AND VALUES

Adjustment layers make changes to an image that can be undone or refined. It's like viewing the picture through a lens and adjusting the lens instead of the picture itself (imagine wearing yellow-tinted sunglasses). They are non-destructive changes that do not alter the original image.


Levels adjusts the black, white, and gray tones to make an image lighter or darker. Move the black, white and gray triangles to adjust the tonal quality.


Color Balance adjusts the overall color tones of the image. Use the triangles to adjust the balance of the colors.

## REPAIRING BLEMISHES

Use the healing tools to remove dust, scratches, wrinkles, and other blemishes. These are destructive changes - they will make changes to the original photo. Make sure you duplicate your photo layer so you can work on a copy and revert back to the original if you want to start again.


Spot Healing Brush - Quickly removes spots or blemishes from the photo. Just point and click on the blemish.

Healing Brush - Just like the Spot Healing Tool with more control. Define a "source point" first: hold down alt/option and click a "good" part of the picture. Now, point and click on the blemish.

Patch Tool - This tool lets you click and drag to draw a circle around a blemish. Then, click and drag that circle to a "good" area.

Content-Aware Move Tool - Moves one part of the picture to another place. Click and drag to draw a circle around the area you want to move. Then, click and drag that circle to move it elsewhere.

Red Eye Tool - Removes red eye. Just point and click on the red eye.
